What is a cookie and what is it used for?

A cookie is a text file that may be saved, depending on the options you choose, in a dedicated space on the hard drive of your device (computer, tablet, etc.) when you access an online service using your browser. It is transmitted to your browser by a website's server. Each cookie is assigned an anonymous identifier. The cookie file allows its issuer

to identify the device on which it is saved during the period for which this cookie is valid or saved. A cookie does not make it possible to identify individuals. When you access the orange.com site, we may, depending on your choices, install statistics cookies.

Statistics cookies on orange.com

These cookies make it possible to calculate site visitor statistics and detect any browsing issues in order to monitor and improve the quality of our services. You may change your browser settings at any time in order to express

and modify your preferred options for cookies, and particularly statistics cookies. You may also configure your browser to block certain cookies. If you block our cookies, your visit of the orange.com site will no longer be recorded in our traffic measurement tools, but you may no longer be able to access certain features which are nevertheless necessary for browsing certain sections of our site.

How to change your browser settings?

on Chrome

- Click on the spanner icon in your browser's toolbar
- Select Settings
- Click on Show advanced settings
- In the "Privacy" section, click on the Content settings button
- In the "Cookies" section, you can block third-party cookies and site data

on Firefox

- At the top of the Firefox window, click on the Firefox button (Tools menu in Windows XP), then select Options
- Select the Privacy tab
- Click on Show advanced settings
- Define your History settings: use custom settings for history
- Unselect the option to Accept cookies

on Safari

- Go to Settings > Preferences
- Click on the Privacy tab
- Click on Show advanced settings
- In the "Block cookies" section, select "Always"

on Internet Explorer

- Go to Tools > Internet Options
- Click on the Privacy tab
- Click on the Advanced button and select "Override automatic cookie handling"

on Opera

- Go to Settings > Preferences
- Click on the Advanced tab
- In the "Cookies" section, select "Never accept cookies"
